Message from the Network Director

We have many successes to celebrate as we strive to improve Veteran care and fulfill our Mission to serve those who served us. In 2023, VISN 10 staff entered 46 Shark Tank submissions resulting in 12 semifinalists and 3 finalists, the highest of any VISN. Congratulations to all the participants!

We've successfully added 2,400 recruits to the 7 hardest to fill positions in VISN 10 and improved hiring time from 104 days to 93 days using all the available flexibilities from the PACT Act.

Our staff at all facilities embody the VISN 10 values every day: integrity, commitment, advocacy, respect, and excellence. We are always ready and willing to provide the best care and support possible, reach as many Veterans as possible, and partner with our communities near and far. By achieving 80% bookable hours across scheduling grids, we increased the total number of bookable hours by 21% in Primary Care, 24% in Surgical Services, and 33% in Specialty Medicine.

As we move into 2024, we will focus on many priorities to honor and serve Veterans in the VISN 10 area in the communities in which they live. Some of those priorities include, but are not limited to: Serve Veterans with Military Environmental Exposures, connect Veterans to the Soonest and Best Care, Prevent Veteran Suicide, and Support Veterans' Whole Health, their caregivers and survivors.

While all of these are important, I am placing special focus on two, Connecting Veterans to the Soonest and Best Care and Preventing Suicide. We are standing up a special committee for soonest and best care and amplifying our efforts on preventing suicide through mental health hiring efforts, outreach and community partnerships. No Veteran should be left behind.

Our outstanding network of medical centers and community clinics are honored to serve Veterans in Michigan, Indiana, Ohio, and Northern Kentucky. Our medical centers are among the best in the country. We are thankful to them for all they do, and to you for all your support and commitment to our mission.

• The Center for **Development & Civic** Engagement (CDCE) and the Office of Veteran **Experience & Employee** Engagement were recipients of the CDCE Strategic Partnership **Excellence** Award recognizing an organization internal to VA that has collaborated with CDCE to build or facilitate impactful volunteer assignments, assisting in the implementation of community partnerships, significantly utilizing a monetary donation, or contribution to a major program or activity.

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) star rating system provides Medicare recipients with unbiased ratings on healthcare providers within the Medicare network. The overall star rating for hospitals summarizes quality information on important topics, such as readmissions and deaths after heart attacks or pneumonia. The rating system assigns each healthcare provider and/or facility a level of quality from one to five stars to convey a variety of measures across 5 areas of quality into a single star rating for each hospital. Ann Arbor was awarded the Nurse Residency Coordinating Center by the Office of Academic Affiliations (it is the only one in the VA).



- The Chillicothe VAMC aggregated trust score as reported on VSignals FY23 is 92.5%, 1.8% above the national average of 90.7%.
- The Chillicothe VAMC **Employee Engagement** Committee is the backbone of our engagement activities such as the weekly All **Employee Virtual Town** Meeting. This group of staff, representing all levels and areas of the medical center staff, collaborate with leadership to foster and create a culture of engagement. The 2023 All **Employee Survey reflects** their work.

Cincinnati remains a national leader in Innovation. One fully executed license for Terri Ohlinger's Drop Ease, two provisional patents; one for Suzanne Zwerin's Air Pillow On A Roll (APOAR) and one for Kevin Johnson's Patient Positioning Device are just a few of the many local accomplishments. The Remote Temperature Monitoring Team lead by Dr. Suhail Masadeh, Dr. Kyle Nordrum and Mr. Josh Manis are participating in eight national site visits, learning how to help engage Podiatrists in three of the available RTM solutions and navigate barriers.



VISN 10 finished strong with the Innovation Team being nominated for Innovation Specialist(s) of the year, a Shark Tank Bid Win for "From Resistance to Resilience: A Veteran's Renewal with Ketamine". Finishing strong, Cincinnati kept its streak alive with a 2023 Investee of the Year Winner, Suzanne Zwerin (Terri Ohlinger, 2020, Kevin Johnson 2022).



In fiscal year 2023, the Cincinnati VA PACT ACT Team developed a robust communication plan to develop messaging to Veterans and family members of Veterans about VA's PACT ACT Law. These efforts resulted in the Cincinnati VA conducting 26,094 toxic exposure screenings and directing Veterans to Service Offers for filing claims for PACT ACT benefits. Part of the communication plan involved a tactic for a Resource Phone Line effort conducted through a local television news program that resulted in over 200 phone calls received during the one-half hour news program.

What If Amputees Could Feel?

For the past 15 years, biomedical engineer Dr. Dustin Tyler, jointly employed by Case Western and Cleveland VA Medical Center, has been engaged in research to improve health and daily living experiences for individuals who have amputated limbs or compromised neural sensations. Dr. Tyler aims to provide these individuals with advanced prosthetics that can provide feedback to the brain to simulate a sensation of touch.

New Electronic Health Record

The VA Central Ohio Healthcare System transitioned to VA's new electronic health record (EHR), April 2023. Columbus is the third VA to make this transition, following VA medical centers in Spokane and Walla Walla, Washington. Veterans who use the My HealtheVet patient portal now will use the new VA patient portal, My VA Health, to access records and prescriptions for their care at Columbus VA.

- Awarded a Joint Incentive Funding providing 2.5+ million to establish a musculoskeletal program on a virtual combined active duty and Veterans virtual platform.
- Hosted the first annual Veterans Integrated Service Network 10 Innovations Summit focused on providing innovative care and procedures to Veterans in April of 2023.
- We achieved a V-Signals Trust Score of 93.3 and the Dayton VA consistently stayed one or more points above national average for the past 12 months.

- Successfully launched the Innovations Team, initiated the first community partnership in Dayton related to enhancing innovations for Veterans to improve care.
- Positive long-term care reviews resulting in an overall Community Living Center (CLC) 5 star rating (increased from 4 star in FY 22).
- Specialty Care Overall Satisfaction SHEP scores increased four points from 85.0 in FY22 to 89.5 by the end of FY23.
- Our All Employee Survey response rate increased 8 points from 75% in FY22 to 83% in FY23 which is higher than both the VISN and national response rates. We also improved our scores in Best Places to Work from 66 in FY22 to 77 in FY23—an 11 point increase which exceeds the VISN and national scores.

- We rank 4 out of 5 stars in industry patient experience and quality rankings as of July 2023, besting all private sector hospitals in the Dayton area.
- Received a four-star rating from Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.
 First time CMS has included VA facilities in its annual Overall Hospital Quality Star Ratings.
- Dayton VA Medical Center was awarded the 2023
 Dayton Nonprofit of the Year Award, in the Veteran Benefits category, by
 Dayton Magazine. The Dayton VA was also awarded Outstanding




New Detroit VALOR Center!
